




Synopsis


For thousands of years, China was ruled by the iron rod of imperial dynasties. In 1644, the Qing dynasty came to power, leading to an oppressive regime marked by widespread corruption and devastating military losses to foreign powers. The insidious opium trade, which the government was unable to eradicate or control, threw China into a nationwide epidemic.

The Qing court's defeat to England, France and Germany in the Opium Wars, and to the Eight Nation Alliance during the subsequent Boxer Rebellion, were devastating blows to Chinese national pride that lit the fuse of individuals who dared to stage armed uprisings against the government.

EAST WIND tells the epic true story of the brave men and women, including Sun Yat-sen, widely considered the founder of modern China, and many others who sacrificed their lives for a better future. Many of the early uprisings failed miserably, forcing the revolutionaries into exile. With time and perseverance, they eventually succeeded, but their personal and collective losses were staggering. A power struggle would follow after Sun's death, ending the initial series with more questions than answers.

Lead Character


Dr. Sun Yat-sen was a restless dreamer and strategist; an intellectual yet prone to fantasy; ever loyal to his revolutionary cause but cheated on his multiple wives; he spent millions of donations but died penniless.

Born in China in 1866, he is sent to live with his brother in Hawaii where he is introduced to democratic ideals and Christianity. Returning to China he graduates from medical college and marries a village girl his family chooses. Sun is a restless soul questioning his traditions, religion, imperialism, marriages and even his own profession.

Sun disobeys his family by converting to Christianity and joins revolutionary groups bent on destroying the Qing Dynsaty hold on power. He is banned from China then travels worldwide to raise funding for the revolution. In his quest to establish a democracy is plagued by constant failures, civil wars, arrests, kidnapping, fugitive bounties and marital trouble.

Ultimately he rallies his country to reject a 2000 year old system of imperialism to establish a democratic Republic of China. He is forever known as the Father of the Nation.





Empress Dowager Cixi -Frustrated, cunning, lonely, ruthless, angry, conniving, naive, intelligent.

Born as Cixi Taihou in China 1835; Regent of the Qing Dynasty; effectively ruled China 1861-1908; sister of Empress Dowager Ci'an. During her reign she ruled under extreme diffulculties: Taiping Rebellion, Sino-Russia War, Boxer Rebellion, internal uprisings, foreign empires invasion, Hundred Days' Reform, abdication of throne ending 2000 years of imperialsm. She and Emperor both died within 24 hours of each other. Autopsy performed 100 years later show Emperor Guangxi had levels of arsenic in remains 2000 times higher than normal, leaving open the possiblity of a murdersuicide.

Born in China 1863, becomes sailor US Merchant Marine moves to North Carolina as Methodist preacher; appointed religious missionary to Shanghai; leaves church to own printing press business; inspired revolutionary and ally of Sun Yat-sen but parts with him for a time after his young daughter marries Sun. A man ahead of his time for sending all six of his children to America to be college educated and his three daughters became famous in their own right for being progressive women of Asia and America.



Charlie Soong devout Christian,
progressive internationalist,
doting father of six, wealthy
financier of Dr. Sun Yatsen.



The Soong Sisters all born in China, educated in the United States were influential daughters of Charlie Soong the financier of revolutionary Sun Yat-sen.

Ai-ling "Nancy" Soong - Stubborn, direct, aloof, attractive. Oldest daughter of Charlie Soong, she marries H.H. Kung, China's first multi-millionaire founder of Central Bank of China.

Ching-ling "Rosamonde" Soong - Beautiful, serious, quiet, loyal, smart. Middle daughter of Charlie Soong, she marries Dr. Sun Yat-sen, twenty seven years her senior later becomes Vicechair in Communist Party.

Mei-ling Soong - Naughty, spoiled, precocious, fun-loving, homely. Youngest daughter of Charlie Soong, she marries General Chiang Kai-shek, President of Republic of China from 1928 to 1975.

The Soong Sisters marriages and alleged goals has been summed up in the Maoist quote,

"One loved money,
one loved power,
one loved her country."



Chiang Kai-shek

He become a powerful general appointed by Sun to lead the Whampoa Military Academy, later protected Sun during a military attack on the presidential palace. General Chiang would marry Soong Mei-ling. which gave him the coveted title of brother-in-law to Sun.

Chen Qimei

A Chinese revolutionary activist, close political ally of Sun Yat-sen, and early mentor of Chiang Kai-shek. He was as one of the founders of the Republic of China, and the uncle of Chen Guofu and Chen Lifu.


Yuan Shikai

A Chinese military and government official who rose to power during the late Qing Dynasty. He established the first modern army and a more efficient provincial government in the last years of the Qing Empire before the abdication of the last Qing Emperor in 1911. Through negotiation, he became the first president of the Republic of China in 1912.

Song Jiaoren


He was a Chinese republican revolutionary, political leader and a founder of the Kuomintang. He was assassinated in 1913 after leading his Kuomintang party to victory in China's first democratic elections.





Sir James Cantile

Scottish doctor, pioneer of first aid and founder of Hong Kong College of Medicine for Chinese. Later he helped free his former pupil Sun Yat-sen when kidnapped in London.



Japanese philosopher who aided and supported Sun Yatsen during the Xinhai Revolution. While Sun was in Japan, he assisted Sun in his travels as he was wanted by Qing dynasty authorities.





Qiu Jin

Strong-willed woman fond of wearing men's clothing, who left her husband and children to take up the mantle of revolutionary. She attempted to assassinate the local governor Enmin, but the plan failed. She became the first female revolutionary to be executed by the Qing government.

Song Jiaoren

A Chinese republican revolutionary, political leader and a founder of the Kuomintang. He was assassinated in 1913 after leading his Kuomintang party to victory in China's first democratic elections.



Episode Highlights



Flashbacks of Opium Wars, Taiping Rebellion, Huong Xiuquan. Qing Dynasty loses war with Japan, Yuan advances. Episode 3 - Sun Yat-sen fails upsrising, escapes to Hawaii then kidnapped in London. Charlie Soong leaves missionary, opens print business, becomes revolutionary. Empress Cixi takes power. Episode 4 - Boxer Rebellion strikes China, Empress Dowager struggles to maintain rule. 




