EXT. PHIL DRAKE'S SUBURBAN HOME - MORNING

SUBURBAN HELL. Tacky cookie-cutter houses. All have usual holiday decorations except the DRAKE home. A large eightarmed Indian statue stands alongside an inflatable snowman that sports a third eye on its forehead.

INT. DRAKE HOME FOYER - MORNING

Colored lantern lights decorate the foyer. Hard charging sales rep PHIL DRAKE is about to leave for work. Eight year old son RAVI fires a football into Phil's stomach.

> PHIL Can't now Ravi. Here. (points to wall) He's going long!

Phil throws the ball off the wall.

PHIL (CONT'D) See? It comes right back! The imagination is a wonderful thing!

Phil's wife BAHTYA enters.

BAHTYA (MIFFED)

You're working? You promised the kids you'd be home! Susan Garrett's husband is taking them to Aspen for the Holidays!

PHIL Susan Garrett's husband is a plastic surgeon! He lifts one ass then takes a month off! Sales isn't like that. BAHTYA It's your holiday not mine bigshot! I sacrifice too! My parents wanted to disown me when I married you!

Phil exits, momentarily relieved as he closes the front door. A MOTION ACTIVATED SANTA CLAUS DOORKNOCKER HO HO'S, DROPS ITS PANTS AND FARTS. Phil RIPS OUT THE BATTERY. The MORNING PAPER HITS HIM. Phil chases the paperboy and THROWS THE BATTERY at him.

> PHIL Jacob! One of these days I'm gonna knock you right into Christmas past!

YIN AND YANG

-"I love working the holidays Larry!"

INT. NEVIN'S GROUP LOBBY - MORNING

GRACE, a dismissive secretary sits at her desk. Phil enters.

GRACE Larry wants to see you. Lockhart's in there. Maybe it's a *firing*?

PHIL What?! Fire his number one guy?

GRACE A girl can dream.

Phil grabs a framed picture off Grace's desk.

PHIL Boyfriend?

Grace grabs the picture back.

GRACE Keep your hands off my stuff! PHIL Right! Every guy wants to get his hands on your 'stuff.'

GRACE You'd be surprised.

PHIL So what's the fad this week?

GRACE I don't know. Jiu Jitsu or something. What am I his mother?

PHIL Grace I've never met anyone whose name and disposition were such opposites.

GRACE Go to hell.

PHIL When I'm with you I feel like I'm halfway there.

Grace starts to FLIP OFF Phil from behind as he walks away.

PHIL (CONT'D) Right back at ya.

INT. LARRY NEVIN'S OFFICE - MOMENTS LATER

Japanese style office. LARRY NEVINS, has sales rep PETER LOCKHART bent over the desk in a SUGGESTIVELY AWKWARD MARTIAL ARTS HOLD.

PHIL Two questions; Are you two going to get a room? And why is Grace such a stone cold be-atch?

Larry releases Peter and CONTINUES PRACTICING MOVES.

LARRY She got left at the altar once.

PHIL Smart guy. You should put *him* in sales.

LARRY Don't tempt me. PHIL

Nice PJ's, Lar. Yoko dress you?

PETER

Yuno.

LARRY

<u>Yono</u> thinks I have too many irons in the fire. Since I've been with her I've realized something is missing in my life.

PHIL

David Carradine?

LARRY

Balance. Yin and Yang. Opposing forces working together to create strength and a solid foundation. Peter wasn't much of a challenge. Try to throw me Phil.

PHIL I'm not throwing you.

LARRY

Throw me or I cut your commission rate in half.

Phil throws Larry easily in one motion.

LARRY (CONT'D) It's only been a week! Help me up.

PHIL By February you'll be Jackie Chan.

LARRY Why don't you sit down Phil?

PHIL

You know in Western civilization it's customary to not have an *audience* when you fire someone.

LARRY

Relax. You're not getting fired.

PHIL

Who said anything about me?

Phil makes a 'just kidding' gesture at Peter.

LARRY

Guys. Why do our clients need a media agency? Because they're inarticulate. They need us to speak for them. But in order to do that we must be able to speak *to* them. You two are articulate in complimentary ways; each with your own strengths, your own styles --

PHIL

-- Cut to the chase Larry.

LARRY

Peter's a nice guy. You're a dick. I'm pairing you up.

PHIL

That's crazy! I'm your best sales rep! He's been here what--five months? And I guarantee I've beaten him every one of those months!

LARRY

Do you know the abandonment rate for your recent accounts?

PHIL

No I don't and frankly if some people can't keep their word and honor their commitments I don't see how that reflects poorly on me!

LARRY

My Eastern studies have taught me that it's about hearts and minds, not aggression. Okay maybe some of it's about aggression. The point is you intimidate people into making decisions they're not comfortable with. Then when their head clears they call me and cancel. And between what you sell and lose and what Peter sells and keeps it's a wash. Besides Peter wants to learn from the best, don't you Peter? (ignoring Peter) Of course he does.

PHIL

Who? Who do I intimidate?

LARRY Chuck Fox says you told him something might happen to his kids if he didn't up his package level.

PHIL I told Chuck Fox if he didn't spend some money and diversify his sales would suffer and maybe he can't afford to send his kids to a good school.

LARRY That's what you said?

PHIL It's what I meant.

LARRY There's a guy Donald O'Shaughnessy starting a company up north. *Castle Industries*. They make lures.

Larry drops a fishing lure into the goldfish bowl.

LARRY (CONT'D) He's going to need media and display for conventions. I know it's short notice but he wants to get this done ASAP. Peter you come up with some on site display and copy ideas. Phil you turn on the charm - such as it is. You guys can go up tomorrow and reel this in before the holidays.

PETER Um, sir? That's Christmas Eve.

PHIL I love working the holidays, Larry.

LARRY

Good, it's settled. Get directions from Grace. She grew up there.

PHIL Grace grew up there? Then I'm sure we'll be welcomed with open arms.

LARRY

That's the spirit! So, questions, comments?

Phil raises his hand.

LARRY (CONT'D)

Phil?

PHIL If he talks my ear off all the way up there can I leave him?

PETER

Good one.

Larry bows. A practice kick knocks the fishbowl over. The lure is hooked to the goldfish. He presses the intercom.

LARRY Grace. Small pliers, large mop.

ROAD TRIP

-"The point is sometimes you gotta be the bad guy."

EXT. NUMBER 6 WEDGEWOOD APARTMENTS - MORNING

Phil arrives in a PLAIN LOOKING, LATE MODEL SEDAN and honks.

INT. PHIL'S CAR - MOMENTS LATER

Peter gets in with a briefcase and can of SPAGHETTIOS.

PETER Sorry. Sorry.

Phil drives away as Peter places the Spaghettios on the dash.

PHIL Don't sorry me. Someone should be apologizing to us. Christmas Eve! (eyes Spaghettios) You're not actually going to eat those?

PETER They're filling. They keep you going for hours.

Phil shudders.

PETER (CONT'D) So you know where we're going?

Phil HANDS AN ENVELOPE FROM GRACE ON THE DASHBOARD to Peter.

PETER (CONT'D) (reads) Dear Peter and Phil, I don't know where Castle Industries is. I blew out of that town twenty years ago and never looked back. Good luck, your co-worker, Grace.

PHIL

She really gives a hundred and ten percent doesn't she?

PETER (GRABBING CELL) I'll google it.

PHIL

You can't google a startup. I guess we'll have to break up the checkers tournament at the general store and ask directions. Doesn't matter. This is a big *no sale* anyway.

PETER

How do you know?

PHIL

Think about it. A sales call on Christmas Eve? Maybe this guy's avoiding his family. Or he's alone and can't face that.

PETER The client's wishes are what's important.

PHIL And what about *our* wishes? Admit it. Neither of us wants to be here.

PETER (SARCASTIC) But you 'love working the holidays.

PHIL

My wife and kids are mad at me and brownie points with Larry is no compensation. And for what? To share a glass of eggnog with some shmuck in bunghole county? PETER Nice attitude.

PHIL I'm a realist. I'm a strategist. What do you notice about this car?

Peter looks around.

PETER

Nothing.

PHIL

Exactly. We're going into unknown territory so the safest impression is no impression.

PETER

You rented a car so you won't impress someone you don't know?

PHIL

Not a rental. A *borrow*. You know Billy Costa?

PETER Yeah the crazy car salesman on TV?

PHIL

He's a huge opera buff and I know a guy in the ticket office at the civic center. I get Billy opera tickets. He lets me borrow any vehicle I want.

PETER

And what does the ticket guy get?

PHIL

I stopped dating his sister and married Bahtya. He's eternally grateful. See if I know a guy's a sportsman I'll show up in a truck with a gun rack. If he's an environmentalist I drive a hybrid.

PETER

Billy Costa doesn't sell those.

PHIL

Raoul the detailing guy slaps a hybrid logo on and bingo I'm green. He's also my brother-in-law.

So isn't Raoul mad that you married his sister?

PHIL

Bahtya was living with Raoul when I met her so he's grateful too.

PETER

Your being deceptive. It's more productive if a client knows you and you know your client.

PHIL

Like your auto parts account where the guy blew his entire budget on an actor playing a muffler?

PETER

That's how he wanted to spend his money, and by the way that actor was talented. He did summer stock.

PHIL He wandered around an intersection blind and deaf in a muffler costume

and got hit by a girl on a moped.

PETER It generated a buzz.

PHIL

Buzz! Our job is to save these guys from themselves.

PETER The customer is always right.

PHIL

Let me tell you something about that customer is always right crap. The customer is *usually* wrong. When you've been at this as long as I have you'll understand that.

EXT. FAST FOOD DRIVE THRU - CONTINUOUS

Phil gets coffee and a donut, FINISHING THEM BOTH before reaching the pay window.
